The Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) is committed to working with our sovereign tribal partners in a government-to-government manner. Please join us to discuss possible impacts of agency rule changes on tribal health systems in Oklahoma.

Every year, before legislative session, the OSDH updates rules and submits requests to the Secretary of State's Office of Administrative Rules (OAR) for consideration. We want to assure that any rule changes are vetted first by our tribal partners.

The 2020 rule submission process will happen in 2 phases. Below is an overview of the topics for the first phase. Tribal Consultation for the second set of rule changes will be held in early March, 2020. Topics and details will be released soon.

CHAPTER & TOPIC

BRIEF OVERVIEW

555 Good Samaritans

Relates to 'Good Samaritans' that have been exposed to communicable diseases while rendering aid. Updating rule language to comply with past legislation. Amends definition of 'Good Samaritan' and addresses health care facilities determining risk exposure and release of source-patient testing.

605 Tuberculosis Testing

Updating multiple rule chapters to align with new CDC recommendations.

641 Ambulatory Services

Air & ground ambulances, EMS, Good Samaritan, EMS (military license reciprocity), and stretcher aid vans. Updating rule language to align with industry and national standards. Modifying required equipment.

642 OERSSIRF

Oklahoma Emergency Response Systems Stabilization and Improvement Revolving Fund. Updating rule language to change number of required panel members from 9 to 5. Changes rule regarding appointment process for panel members.

663 Psychotropic Medications

Updates language to align with SB142 requiring nursing homes/LTC facilities to get informed consent from patients and families before administering powerful antipsychotic medications.

667 ST-Elevated Myocardial Infarction (STEMI)

Update to align with SB156. Specifies the requirement for hospitals to submit data into STEMI registry in addition to stroke and trauma related illness and injury.
